

St. James Episcopal church will be filled with a fashionable gathering Saturday night, when the marriage of Miss Gertrude Nunnemacher, daughter of Mrs. Emelie Nunnemacher, to William H. Schuchardt will be celebrated at 6 o'clock. The service will be read by the Rev. Frederick Edwards. The wedding music will be rendered by Hambitzer's orchestra, which will play the wedding march from Lohengrin as a professional, "O Perfect Love," during the ceremony, and the Mendelssohn march as a recessional.

The church is decorated with autumn leaves and yellow chrysanthemums in profusion, the chancel being banked with foliage, palms and flowers.

The bride will be attended by her cousin, Mrs. Martin Lindsay, as matron of honor and Miss Anita Mann as maid of honor. Little Misses Polly Sawyer and Marie Louise Partridge will be flower girls. The bride will wear a gown of white ivory satin, trimmed with old point lace and having a long court train. Her long tulle veil will be draped over a shorter one of real lace. She will carry a shower bouquet of lilies of the valley.

The maid of honor will be gowned in pink satin with a lace overdress, trimmed with lace and edged with seal. The attendants will wear black picture hats trimmed with lace ruchings and pink rosebuds.
