The Shorewood house and garden of Mr. and Mrs. William Merrill Chester, 3590 N. Lake dr., will be shown. The two Milwaukee stops will be at the senior Mrs. Albert O. Trostel's garden, 3232 N. Lake dr., and at Mrs. Bernhard A. Froemming's home, 3474 N. Lake dr.

The route of the tour will be illustrated on a map designed by Gerrit V. Sinclair, Wisconsin artist and teacher at the Layton School of Art. The map will be part of the ticket.

Visitors travel in their own cars. Tickets will be sold at the school and the gardens and by members of the league. Proceeds from the tour will go to the scholarship fund of the school.
