

Realist paintings on display in Krannert

American realist paintings from the collection of Alfred R. Bader, chairman of Sigma-Aldrich Chemical Co., will go on display in Purdue's Krannert Drawing Room Monday.

The exhibit includes approximately 30 works by two contemporary painters, John Whalley of Pennsylvania and Charles Munch of Wisconsin. The works by Munch are all oil paintings, while those by Whalley are drawings, watercolors and tempera paintings.

Bader, who is Milwaukee-based, is well known for his collection and restoration of 17th-century paintings by the Dutch masters. Bader also collects 16th- and 17th-century Italian works and American works that show the same careful attention to detail as the Dutch masters.

The exhibit is sponsored by Purdue's Krannert Graduate School of Management and is free to the public. It will remain on display through Sunday, Oct. 14. Hours are 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The closing time will extend to 5:30 p.m. with the start of classes on Wednesday.
