

# Estate Aids Art Center

## Mrs. Wehr Leaving Shares to Library, MU and Others

Mrs. Ethel E. Wehr, who already had given gifts worth an estimated \$50,000 to the Milwaukee Art Center, left 49% of her estate to be divided between the art center and other institutions, according to a will filed in the county court. She died Feb. 19.

A petition for probate of the will filed Tuesday with County Judge Rudolph J. Mudroch said that Mrs. Wehr's estate would be more than \$100,000. It is expected to be much more. She was the widow of Edward R., former vice-president of the Wehr Steel Co., 2100 S. 54th st. Mrs. Wehr, 76, lived at 3035 W. Wisconsin av.

Mrs. Wehr left 15% of her estate to the Marquette university medical school for a fund in the names of Edward and Ethel Wehr, to help pay salaries of young teachers. She also left 8% to the art center, 8% to the public library to purchase books in the fine and decorative arts, 9% to the Milwaukee Protestant Home for the Aged and 9% to the YWCA for improvements in a girls' camp.

The remainder of the estate is to be divided among friends and Mrs. Wehr's immediate survivor, Mrs. Kathleen Hausfelder, Hollywood, Calif., a sister.
