

## Rembrandt portrait earns 'modest profit'

MILWAUKEE (AP) — A collector who bought a 360-year-old Rembrandt portrait in July for \$7.94 million says he made “a modest profit” with its sale to an Amsterdam museum.

Alfred Bader said from London that the 50-by-40-inch work, completed by Rembrandt van Rijn in 1632, would go to the Rijksmuseum because “this is where it belongs.”

The museum is noted for its collection of 17th-century Dutch paintings.

Bader, until recently chairman emeritus of Sigma-Aldridge Chemical Corp., was the successful bidder for the work at a sale of old master paintings held at Sotheby's in London.

The work is a likeness of the noted Dutch churchman Johannes Uytenbogaert. It had been in the estate of an English nobleman, the Earl of Rosebery, and was being offered for sale for the first time this century.
