

Art League Plans Tour

June 7 and 8 have been chosen by the Layton Art League for the benefit garden tour of Lake Shore and River Hills gardens. Visitors are expected from all parts of Wisconsin, northern Illinois and other states.

The Layton Art League's garden tours, high spots of the spring seasons from 1936 to 1943, were interrupted in 1944 when gasoline rationing made travel by car almost impossible and shortages of help made the upkeep of gardens difficult.

This year's tour, the first since 1943, will include not only notable gardens but some homes. Arrangements are now being made with garden owners and the list of homes and gardens to be shown this year will be announced shortly, according to Mrs. O. A. Sander.

Mrs. Arthur Spence has been named chairman of the garden tour. She will be assisted by Mrs. Louis Dauer Jr., who, before her marriage, was a student of the Layton Art School.

Mrs. Rodney Kilham, Mrs. Sander and Mrs. Spence are members of the general arrangements committee. Mrs. F. C. Heldner is chairman of the garden hostesses. Mrs. Roger Minahan is ticket chairman.

Proceeds from the benefit garden tour will go into the scholarship and equipment funds of the Layton Art School. The tours have made professional training possible for many talented students.
