

# Women Here Preparing for Writer's Visit

ADMIRERS of V. Sackville-West and her literary work will have an opportunity of meeting this famous English writer and of hearing her speak Thursday when she will appear at the Woman's Club of Wisconsin in a talk on "Changes in the English Social Order." On this, her first lecture tour in America, Miss Sackville-West is accompanied by her distinguished husband, Harold Nicolson.

Mrs. Theodore Vogel and Mrs. Douglass Van Dyke will be hostesses at the club Thursday. Preceding the afternoon's program there will be a luncheon at the club at which Miss Sackville-West, if she arrives here in time, will be guest of honor.

As the only daughter of Lord and Lady Sackville of Knole in Kent, the Hon. V. Sackville-West's visit to this country is of more than ordinary social significance. As the author of "The Edwardians" and "All Passion Spent," her visit is of great literary importance. Miss Sackville-West is also the author of "The Land," the winner of the Hawthornden prize; "Seducers in Ecuador," "Twelve Days," "King's Daughter" and that monumental history of her ancestral home, "Knole and the Sackvilles." She is one of the most brilliant members of the Bloomsbury group, a distinguished gathering of writers who have collected about Virginia and Leonard Woolf and the Hogarth Press, among them Rebecca West, the Sitwells and Lytton Strachey. She is the heroine of Virginia Woolf's "Orlando."

When in England Miss Sackville-West lives at Long Barn Weald, Sevenoaks, near her birthplace, Knole.
