

6,600 to receive degrees at UW, MATC, Edgewood

More than 6,600 students will receive degrees and diplomas this weekend during spring commencement exercises to be conducted by the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Madison Area Technical College and Edgewood College.

UW-Madison ceremonies will be in Camp Randall Stadium at 9:30 a.m. Sunday and MATC ceremonies at 10 a.m. Saturday in the Dane County Coliseum. Edgewood ceremonies will also be at 10 a.m. Saturday in the college gymnasium.

In the event of rain, UW-Madison ceremonies will be in the Field House, also at 9:30 a.m.

UW-Madison is expected to award 3,033 bachelor's degrees, 863 master's degrees, 226 doctorates, 342 law degrees and 143 medical degrees. MATC will award 1,392 associate degrees, 93 two-year diplomas, 539 one-year diplomas, 87 less than one-year diplomas and 79 apprentice diplomas. Edgewood will award 118 degrees.

UW President Robert O'Neil has said UW System campuses will award 11,221 bachelor's degrees this spring and 2,159 graduate degrees. The advanced degrees will include 51 doctorates at UW-Milwaukee. The two-year UW centers will also confer about 600 associate degrees.

UW-Green Bay graduates will include State Rep. Sharon Metz, who has completed her degree while in the Legislature. UW-Superior graduates will include Charles Moorhouse, 70, who will begin a new career as an illustrator of children's books after graduation.

At UW-Madison, Chancellor Irving Shain will preside and there will be brief comments by Lt. Gov. James Flynn, Regent Ben Lawton of Marshfield, O'Neil, and senior class president Sheryl Packtor. Jonathan Pellegrin, Alumni Association president, will also speak.

Honorary degrees will be presented to Alfred Bader, chairman of Aldrich Chemical Company of Milwaukee; Orville G. Bentley, U.S. First Assistant Secretary of Agriculture; Russell W. Peterson, formerly of Fortage, president of the National Audubon Society; Evelyn Steenbock, scientist and philanthropist and Paul Vanderbilt, curator emeritus of the Wisconsin Historical Society.



The late Alan Schneider, former American Theater director, was to have received an honorary degree, but because the university does not issue the degrees posthumously he will be honored briefly instead. He was killed in a recent motorcycle accident.

Joyce Carol Oates, author and writer-in-residence at Princeton University, will also receive an honorary degree, but because of an illness in the family will not be able to attend the ceremony. The university will defer awarding her degree until a later date when she will be able to be present.

Because of seating limitations,

tickets will be required for admission to the Field House should commencement be moved inside. Each graduate renting a cap and gown is given two tickets. From 15,000 to 20,000 are expected at the ceremonies.

UW-Madison's Honors Convocation will be at 7 p.m. Saturday in the Field House, with honorary degree recipients making brief comments. The military commissioning ceremony for ROTC graduates will be at 8 p.m. Sunday in Mills Concert Hall in the Humanities Building.

MATC Director Norman Mitty will preside at Saturday's MATC commencement. Maria Grauvogl, an accounting program graduate, will speak on behalf of the graduates and Charles Soper, a 1968 graduate, will speak on behalf of alumni.

Distinguished teaching awards from the MATC Foundation will be presented to William Buckingham, adult basic education; Patricia Bennett, associate degree nursing; and E. Lynn Swartz, dental auxiliaries.

David Ross of General Casualty Company will be presented a distinguished service citation.

The speaker at Edgewood's commencement will be Sister Cecilia Carey, prioress general of the Sinuana Dominicans and former Edgewood president. A reception will be held in Regina Hall after the commencement ceremony.
