

C. DUNKERSON DIES IN KENTUCKY

Lingering Illness Fatal to Scion of Noted Local Family

Casselberry Dunkerson of Louisville, Ky., 54, formerly of this city, died at his home in Louisville yesterday morning at 7:30 o'clock following an illness of several months of anaemia.

Mr. Dunkerson was the only son of the late Mr. and Mrs. R. K. Dunkerson, for more than half a century identified with the business and social life of Evansville. He was the namesake of his grandfather, Dr. Isaac Casselberry, a prominent physician. He attended the public school here and was graduated in 1894 from Yale university. He was a roommate at that time of his brother-in-law, Samuel L. Orr of this city.

Following his graduation he moved to Louisville where he was in the tobacco business with his father, one of the firm of White, Dunkerson and company. His father, later retired from the firm and became president of the Old State bank of this city.

During the World war, Dunkerson was connected with the War Trade board in Washington, D. C. Following the war he returned to Louisville and has since that time been vice-president of the Lincoln Trust and Savings bank of Louisville.

He is survived by his wife, a daughter, Patricia, and a sister, Mrs. Samuel I. Orr of this city. Mr. and Mrs. Orr with their elder son, Samuel Orr and daughter, Miss Kendrick Orr have gone to Louisville to attend the funeral which will be held at the Church of the Advent this afternoon at 3:30 o'clock with interment in Cave Hill cemetery.
